The deadline for all parts of the application is: Friday, May 19, 2023. ALL parts of the application must be either post-marked (mail) or received (email) by the deadline.

Submitting an application is free. However, those applicants who are accepted and choose to participate in Leadership Lincoln Youth 27 will be charged a \$350.00 tuition fee. **Scholarships are available to cover part or the complete tuition fee.** If you are interested in a tuition scholarship, you must indicate your interest on your application.

2. Program Description—Leadership Lincoln Youth is a TWO-YEAR Commitment

- Sophomore Year (2023-2024): participants will attend NINE monthly seminars focused on developing leadership skills and learning about the community.
 - o Participants will **develop** leadership skills.
- Junior Year (2024-2025): participants will attend TWO monthly seminars alongside the new class of sophomore participants.
 - o Participants will use leadership skills.

3. Applicant Instructions

All individuals are welcome to apply. Please type answers (or clearly print answers) and provide enough information to allow us to get the best representation of you and your interest in civic engagement. You may attach extra sheets.

We believe in diversity and equity. 4. School/Principal Approval

Youth Leadership Lincoln seminars conflict with school so your participation in the program must be approved by your school. This form should be signed by the applicant's current principal.

5. Tuition and Scholarships

- Applying to Leadership Lincoln is free and open to all Lancaster County students who will be in tenth grade during the 2023-2024 school year.
- Leadership Lincoln charges a tuition fee of \$350.00 to all individuals selected to participate in the program. This fee covers expenses such as meals and supplies used during seminars.
- Tuition assistance is available through a scholarship program. If an applicant is
 interested in scholarship support, that request must be made when their application is
 submitted.

6. Application Deadline

Applicants are responsible for making sure ALL application materials are returned to the Leadership Lincoln office by **Friday**, **May 19**, **2023**.

- Forms that are mailed must be post-marked by the deadline.
- Forms that are emailed must be received by 11:59pm on the deadline.
- Forms that are hand-delivered should be received in the office by 5:00pm on the deadline.

Each monthly seminar will be made up of the full class of sophomore participants and a small group of junior participants who will serve as role models. Juniors will work together in advance of the seminar to plan and then facilitate a team-building exercise for the sophomore participants.
